

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- Kereru Hemiphaga novaeseelandiae in a ti-kouka or cabbage tree Cordyline Australis.
- 2 Giant kauri Agathis Australis Giant kauri are felled and native birds displaced.
- 3 Driving dam at Goldie's Bush, Mokoroa Stream c.1922 Indiscriminate environmental damage was caused by the use of driving dams to carry kauri
- **⚠** Vickie Elizabeth Bethell (nee Wilson) b.1964 of English, Irish and Scots holds daughter Jessie and rides the family shire horse. April.
- 5 Jessica Rose Bethell "Jessie" b.2006
- O'Neill's Theodolite Alan O'Neill b. 1802 d. 1886 was a surveyor for the New Zealand Company who from 1853, under the direction of Charles Heaphy, was responsible for surveying much of West Auckland.
- **Graeme John Murdoch** b.1947 of Scots descent, heritage consultant and resident of Waitakere. Graeme wears a tartan Tam o' Shanter celebrating his Scots ancestry and draws attention to the overwhelmingly Celtic origin of early European settlers in West Auckland, particularly during the 1840s when Henderson - a Scots clan name, was called "Dundee Sawmill".
- Vickie Bethell's Border Collie bitch Panda
- 2 Longhorn Airedale dairy cow
- **10** Elliot Bernard Melling b.1992 of Dutch and English

- descent. Elliot is a great-grandson of photographer Jan Willem Endt b. 1907 – d. 1977 from Zaandam. in North Holland, who created an extensive photographic archive of West Auckland in the 1950s.
- Ross McKay Bethell b.1955 d.2008 of Ngapuhi and English descent. Farmer and resident of Te Henga, Ross is a great-grandson of John Neale (Pa) Bethell b.1856 - d.1943, sawmiller, bushman and farmer who came to New Zealand as an infant in 1859.
- **12** Queens' Chain or brass measuring tape, used to calculate length, with chipped enamel plate, folding Pakistani brass pocket knife and sliced Cox's Orange heritage apple.
- Books **West Auckland Remembers** edited by James Northcote-Bade and Fire on the Clay: the Pakeha comes to West Auckland by Dick Scott.
- Reproduction of A Bush Mill at Karekare, West Coast, 1880 oil painting by Charles Bloomfield b.1848 - d.1926
- 15 Wooden 7x7 plum case apple crate used as makeshift artist's table, 19th century Windsor & Newton watercolour paint box, enamel cup and brass paintbrush holder with scrap of paper naming watercolour painter Ellen La Trobe whose picture West Coast, Waitakerei(sic) Ranges c.1899 appears on the front cover of West Auckland Remembers; and yellow electrical extension cord patched with gaffer tape.
- 13 Flowering dandelion and small dead Tauhou or wax-eve Zosterops lateralis.


- 17 Clay brick made by the Archibald Brickworks at the mouth of the Whau River c.1876 -1926.
- (18) Christopher John Baker b. 1952 of Irish and Cornish descent, Resident of Te Henga, Chris, a drainage contractor, uses a wide tread Skelton Auckland Pattern Double bend gum spade able to scrape heavy mud.
- 19 Bricks from New Lynn, Henderson and Hobsonville brickworks with remnant of chimney flue belonging to the kiln of Henderson's Timber Mil.
- Maraea Tauhinu b.1962 of Ngati Paku and Tai Tokerau descent. Resident of Ranui, Maraea appears in a reconstruction of an early 20th century photographic image of Maori woman gum digger.
- 2 Nikau thatch whare on the edge of the bush with sackcloth door and wood slab chimney.
- 2 Ponga Cyathea dealbata
- 23 Q Class steam locomotive train travelling southeast over the Opanuku Bridge.
- 23 Sister Kathleen (Mary Eymard) Franich b 1935 of Croatian and Scots descent. Resident of Henderson and Mercy Sister, Kate is the granddaughter of early Henderson vintner Josip Franich from Vrgorac, in Croatia. She feeds Eddie, a Jerusalem donkey.

Don Buck (Francisco Rodrigues Figueira) b.1870 Madeira, Canary Islands, d.1917. Don Buck was a gum trader who ran his own independent gum diggers' camp somewhere near the Swanson end of Don Buck Road.

- Cushla Parekowhai, of Ngati Whakarongo, Nga Ariki descent, assistant to the artist, rides a donkey in allusion to the work Don Quixote and Sancho Pancha 1850 by French painter Honoré Daumier as a salute to the curious ensemble of local and imported characters that came to the "wild" West.
- 23 Eroded riverbank Wai-o-pareira also known as Henderson Creek damaged by the upstream release of the driving dam.
- **Towlers bird trap** used by Maori.
- 2 Pair of magpies Gymnonorhina tibicen scourge of pastoral farmers introduced to New Zealand in 1860.
- Wine Sap apple tree in high summer on Dragicevich's orchard in Oratia Road.
- 29 Mathew (Mate) Dragicevich b.1960 of Croatian descent, with Swedish scissors and sapling apple tree. Resident of Oratia.
- **30** Male pheasant Phasianus colchicus introduced to Waitakere by Thomas Henderson in 1858.
- 3 Karmela Dragicevich (nee Katavich) b.1934 of Croatian descent, Orchardist, resident of Oratia.
- 32 Benjamin (Ben) Copedo b.1927 of English and Italian descent, Retired storeman/clerk and local historian.
- 33 Artist Allie Eagle b.1949 of English descent. Resident of Te Henga. Allie looks over the shoulder of Charles Frederick Goldie b.1870 - d.1947. Goldie sits on a slab of kahikatea perched on an

- original wine-box from Corban's vineyard, and holds a framed print of his picture The Arrival of the Maoris in New Zealand, 1898 made collaboratively with Louis John Steele b.1842- d.1918, draped by a copy of the 1881 Henderson Electoral Role listing Scots, Irish, English and Maori residents next to a cartoon of David Goldie b.1842 - d. 1926. Member of Parliament for Auckland West 1887-90. prohibitionist and father of C.F Goldie who operated a timber mill at Mokoroa between Muriwai and Te
- 3 Twinings Lady Jane Grey tea in a Royal Albert bone china cup, adjacent to a coaster made of Franich Winery labels c.1910 featuring the distinctive red and white checks of the Croatian coat of arms, with a letter to Joseph Franich acknowledging his gift of wine sent to wounded World War I soldiers stationed at the Trentham Military Camp.
- 35 Framed portrait of William Swanson b. 1819 - d. 1903 by C.F. Goldie. Swanson was an early West Auckland timber miller turned politician and benefactor who encouraged the young Charles Goldie in his pursuit of a career as a painter.
- 36 Copy of The Child Christ in the Temple, questioning with the Doctors, found by his parents, 1898-1911 by C.F Goldie. Model for the title and theme of Child Jesus in the Temple: a community parable for the City of Waitakere by Allie Eagle.

- Simun Ujdur b. 1931 Retired vintner of Croatian descent, from Gradac, on the Adriatic coast of Dalmatia. Simun holds a bukura or wooden cup used for the traditional Croatian shared drinking of wine.
- Rimu table made by the artist's great-aunt Ivy Jacobs b. 1893-d. 1982 with Croatian copper wine jug and funnel from Hvar, brought to New Zealand in 1922 by Petar and Luckrica (nee Soljan) Fredatovich and loaned by Lincoln Wines Estate of Henderson, crystal wineglass and bunch of specimen Black Hamburg grapes, copy of Viticulture in N.Z 1895-1908 by Romeo Bragato, celebrated early developer of New Zealand viticulture, envelope postmarked J Curin & Trubuhovich Kauri Gum Merchant, to Simun Ujdur's uncle containing statement of monies received for gum, dated Henderson, 8 December 1917
- Ron Tomlinson's Dalmatian dog, Alice.
- Mate Ozich b.1920 d.1955 of Croatian descent. Born in Rascane, Dalmatia. Mate joined his sister Ruza Lendich and his wife's uncle Milan Erceg in Swanson, where they planted grapes and began the St Jerome Winery.
- Assid Khaleel Corban b.1925 of Lebanese descent. Resident of Henderson, winery owner, orchid grower and first Mayor of Waitakere City.

- David Clark Harre b.1938 of French, Irish, Scots and English descent. Resident of West Coast Road, Oratia, Dave lifts down a ceramic vase made by his aunt well known early New Zealand potter Briar Gardiner b.1879 - d.1968.
- 43 Wine sap apple tree in autumn leaf.
- Miriam Corban (nee Khouri) b.1927 of Lebanese descent.
- 45 Anna Elizabeth Henshaw (nee Nicolson) b.1980 in Swanson of English and Scots descent. Artist assistant
- Rudi (Rudolf) George Sunde b. 1927 of Croatian descent. Resident of Oratia, Rudi plays a tamburica, a traditional Croatian stringed instrument, accompanied by his wife, folk singer Pat Doreen Sunde (nee Patterson) b.1927
- **120** year old *Early Jewel* plum tree in the Dragecivich orchard at Oratia.
- Peter John Babich b.1932 of Croatian descent. Resident of Henderson and Managing director of Babich Wines, Peter assists his sister Lillian (Ivy) Cibilich (nee Babich) b.1930 acting the role of their mother, Mara Babich (nee Grgric) b.1903 - d.1994.
- Wilhelmus Hendrikus (Bill) Aalbers b. 1928 of Dutch descent.

- 50 House sparrow Passer domesticus, interior wall of packing shed or wine store featuring an exposed cornice from the Corbans Wine Estate in Great North Road, Henderson; miniaturised kauri mortar and pestle carved by Assid Abraham Corban b.1864- d.1941 who with his wife Najibie Tanyus (nee Ataia) b.1871 – d.1957 emigrated from Lebanon in 1902 and purchased ten acres in Henderson where they established the Corban's Wines vineyard; on the shelf beneath, photograph of local botanist Lucy May Cranwell, b.1907 – d.2000 with folded day bill advertising the Circular Saw Line of shipping company Henderson & McFarlane, and ship-in-abottle schooner Lucy Dunn or Lusidan, traded to Maori in 1884 for the purchase of the 1500 acres of land known as the Borough of Henderson; this sits above two lists of Croatian early settlers to West Auckland who arrived from Dalmatia in 1896.
- **51) Waiatarua Telecommunications Tower**, Waitakere Ranges.
- Scales, gavel, pressed grapes and head of a ram traditional symbols of justice, judgement, mercy and grace, generally regarded as the necessary attributes of a good "Council".
- Davorin Ivan Ozich b.1951 in Derventa, Bosnia, of Croatian descent, with wife Christine (nee Staub) b.1960.
- Red plastic sandals.
- 55 Stack of labelled apple boxes.

- **30** Cast iron shoe last from *Pirrits Shoe & Bootmakers* of Henderson.
- **Olive branch** in a **Betham's Pickle** jar. Symbol for peace.
- Upset apple cart. Representing local orchardists and their struggle to address rates' increases, growing land use restrictions and climate change, kauri seedling in PB8 plastic planter bag.
- John Matthew Dragicevich b.1952 of Croatian descent. Senior Finance Manager for Waitakere City Council.
- Sarah Anne Dragicevich b.1980 of Croatian, Italian, Scots and Maori descent.
- Allan Sumich b.1945 of Croatian descent, and his best mate John Montgomery Way (Way-ich) b.1944 of English descent preparing roast lamb on a spit for the Tarara Day in 1999, to commemorate the unique whanaungatanga or bond that Croations have with Maori
- Henderson Railway Station built in 1912 with principal assistant to artist Anabelle Cameron-Lewis b.1977 of Jewish, English and Scots descent, on the platform alongside her Alsatian Collie Cross bitch, Indie.
- Heavy duty extension cord linking all three panels in the picture, representing the contribution the film and television industry have made to the development of Waitakere City.

- Release of eels into the Opanuku Stream by Oratia Primary School children and their instructor in September 2006.
- Dion Branko Vela b.1963 of Croatian descent. Representing one of the last remaining local orchardists.
- Destruction of orchards to make way for housing development interspersed with a red traffic light, a cell phone tower and blackened tree stumps.
- Large macrocarpa. Cupressus Macrocarpa a relic of former land use.
- 68 Fino Valley Vineyard in Henderson Valley Road.
- 35 mm Arriflex motion picture camera.
- **Film set rigging with outdoor microphone**. A *Bob Rules* (Harvey) tag is scrawled on the scaffolding.
- Urban landscape markers including motorway and pedestrian traffic signs with loaded clapperboard giving title of the painting.
- Anne Mary Erceg b. 1937 of Te Roroa, Te Rarawa, Scots, and Croatian descent. Resident of Swanson and gumdigger.
- Hayden Howard b.1996 of Te Roroa, Te Rawara, Croatian, Scots and English descent.
- Spent dandelion head with airborne seed memento mori marking the passage of time.
